S.W.C.D.E.C has a “trinity-phase” approach to youth empowerment

- The “I V.A.L.U.E. Life” summer enrichment program for at-risk youth (Phase I)
- S.T.T.I.O. conflict resolution digital media program for public schools (Phase II)
- Transitional housing program for recently released juveniles and wards of the state. (Phase III)

Children who have experienced trauma or who live in extreme poverty experience a lack of equity and opportunity, and most of the services available lack the intensity and duration needed to change their life trajectories (FOC, 2016). SWCEDC has answered the call by combining our conflict resolution program with over 20 years of digital media experience to educate at-risk youth in the process of resolving conflicts, while advancing their skills in the demanding field of digital media utilizing two (2) curriculums and real time 3D animation

It was birthed out of a sincere passion to assist youth in advancing towards their destiny through the power of education and progressive thought.

Today, SWCEDC has faithfully implanted the S.T.T.O. method and Bushell Media Group Video Arts Program for the 2017-2018 academic school year at Sarah J.
